SELECTION PROCESS FOR THE DOCTORATE DEGREE IN LINGUISTICS

The Collegiate of the *stricto sensu* Graduate Program in Linguistics¹ in the Federal University of Juiz de Fora, in exercise of its statutory duties and powers delegated to it, publicizes the opening of this Public Call² for the Doctorate Degree Course in Linguistics, class starting in 2020.

1. OPENINGS OFFERED:

1.1. For the selective process for the Doctorate Degree Course in Linguistics 2020, up to 16 (sixteen) openings will be offered, according to the following table:

1.5. The results of the approval or rejection of the appeals will be made public until 5:00 PM, 09/09/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

2. CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS:

2.1. The candidates who wish to apply to the Doctorate Degree Course in Linguistics must possess an undergraduate diploma acknowledged by MEC or, in the case of a foreign student, a diploma acknowledged by the competent organizations on their country.

3. APPLICATION PROCESS:

3.1 Applications will be received from 5:00 PM, 09/09/2019 until 4:59 PM, 07/10/2019. Candidates must fill in the electronic form available at www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica, free of charge.

3.2. The necessary documents for the application must be attached to the electronic form, in a PDF format.

3.3. Documents for the application:

3.3.1. Electronic form, properly filled in by the candidate, in which he/she must indicate, mandatorily, the Line of Research and the requested Advisor;

3.3.2. Preliminary research project, according to the model available on Appendix I of this Public Call;

3.3.3. Graduate Diploma or, in the case of candidates who are concluding their graduation, a statement issued by a competent entity from their home institution, stating the foreseen date for the completion of the course, since the completion of the graduation must be prior to the enrolment in the doctorate course;

3.3.4. For candidates who wish to be exempted from the English proficiency exam, proof of proficiency in English based on the following exams must be presented, with scores within the following marks and within the validity period, when applicable: TOEFL ITP (460 points); TOEFL iBT (57 points); IELTS (4.0 points); Cambridge (FCE or higher); TOEIC (550 points); with the exception of foreign candidates who have English as L1, who can be dismissed from the proficiency exam without proof of language proficiency. Alternatively, proof of English proficiency in the master's course will be accepted, when applicable.

3.3.5. For the candidates who wish to be dismissed from the proficiency exam in a foreign Language- Spanish, French, or Latin -, documented proof of Language proficiency in level B1 or higher, with the exception of foreign candidates who have Spanish or French as L1, who can be dismissed from the proficiency exam without proof of language proficiency. Alternatively, proof of Spanish, French, or Latin proficiency in the Master course will be accepted, when applicable.

3.3.6. For foreign candidates who intend to be exempt from the Portuguese proficiency exam but do not have Portuguese as their L1, proof of proficiency in Portuguese on the Exam Celpe-Bras exam (Upper-Intermediate);

3.3.7. Identification document (ID card, passport, driver's license, work permit or professional permit), and, for the Brazilian candidates, CPF, voter registration card and documents that prove the candidate is up to date with their voting duty, available at <http://www.tse.jus.br/eleitor/servicos/certidoes/certidao-de-quitacao-eleitoral>, as well as a document that proves male candidates are up to date with their military duties. All documents must be within a single PDF file.

3.3.8. Lattes Curriculum.

3.4. The results of the approval or rejection of the application requirements will be made public until 5:00 PM, 10/15/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

3.4.1. Appeals against the rejections of application requirements may be filed until 5:00 PM, 10/17/2019, by means of an electronic form available on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica).

3.4.2. Attaching additional documents will not be allowed in the appeal process.

3.4.3. The results of the appeals against the rejection of application requirements will be posted until 5:00 PM, 10/18/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

3.5. If the proofs of language proficiency, in the examinations mentioned in items 3.3.4., 3.3.5., and 3.3.6., are not accepted, the candidates must necessarily take the language proficiency exams, as seen in this Public Call.

3.6. The appeals will be judged by the Selective Process Commission. The exam preparation and correction boards may be heard if necessary.

4. SELECTION STAGES AND DATES:

4.1. The selection process for the Doctorate Degree Course of the *stricto sensu* Graduate Program in Linguistics of UFJF - 2020 - will be carried out in four stages:

Stage 1: Proficiency Exam(s) in:

- Reading in English, for all candidates except those who were approved in Reading in English in the Master course and/or those who were dismissed from the exam by presenting, then, documental proof of English proficiency or, yet, those who presented documental proof according to item 3.3.4;
- Reading in a second foreign Language – Spanish, French, or Latin -, different from the one presented on the Master course;
- Reading and writing in Portuguese, exclusively for deaf candidates;
- Reading and writing in Portuguese, exclusively for foreign candidates whose L1 is not Portuguese

Stage 2: Analysis of preliminary research Project by Research Line;

Stage 3: Analysis of preliminary research Project by the requested Advisor;

Stage 4: Interview.

4.1.1. Since all courses and seminars in the Graduate Program in Linguistics are taught in Portuguese and / or English, and all course programs require reading in English, Portuguese and English proficiency exams are compulsory for all foreign, non-Portuguese-speaking candidates and deaf candidates and they cannot be replaced by equivalent proficiency exams in any other languages.

4.2. The exams will be applied on October 22 and 23, 2019, in the Auditorium of the Faculty of Arts of the Federal University of Juiz de Fora, according to the following schedule:

4.2.1. Foreign candidates who, when applying, present proof of proficiency in Portuguese on the Exam Celpe-Bras exam (Upper-Intermediate) will be exempt from the proficiency exam.

4.2.2. Candidates who, when applying, present proof of proficiency in English based on the following exams, with scores within the following marks and within the validity period, when applicable: TOEFL ITP (460 points); TOEFL iBT (57 points); IELTS (4.0 points); Cambridge (FCE or higher); TOEIC (550 points) will be exempt from the proficiency exam.

4.2.3 Only the deaf and / or foreigner candidates who were approved in or exempt from the proficiency in Portuguese exam will have their English proficiency exams corrected. The rejected candidates will be eliminated from the selection process.

4.2.4. Only the candidates who were approved in the Language Proficiency exams will have their preliminary research projects analysed. The rejected candidates will be eliminated from the selection process.

4.3. The first stage, which is of eliminatory character, will consist of language proficiency exams.

4.3.1. In the first stage, the deaf candidates must produce specific written proof of proficiency in Portuguese and, if they are approved in said exam, they will have assured their right to take the proof of reading proficiency in English exam in LIBRAS. Said exam will be mandatorily recorded in video.

4.3.2. For deaf candidates, the interpretation in LIBRAS of the questions in the English language proficiency exam will be guaranteed. Each question can be interpreted up to three times by an interpreter linked to the UFJF.

4.3.3. Foreign candidates who do not have Portuguese as their L1 must present specific written proof of proficiency in Portuguese. If they are approved in said exam, they must take the proof of proficiency in reading in English exam or present proof documents of English proficiency in the examinations referred to in item 3.3.4, 3.3.5, and 3.3.6 of this Public Call, with the exception of the candidates who have English as their L1.

4.3.4. In the first stage, all registered candidates must take the proficiency in reading in English exam, with the exception of the deaf and foreign candidates who were already eliminated in the specific written exam of proficiency in Portuguese and the candidates who have English as their L1, and the candidates who prove dismissal according to section 4.2.2.

4.3.5. In the first stage, the maximum duration of all exams will be of three hours.

4.3.6. In order to be approved in the first stage, the candidate must obtain a score equal to or greater than 60 (sixty) points in a total of 100 (one hundred) points in each of the applicable exams to his / her profile.

4.3.7. Relevant criteria for the evaluation of the language proficiency exams are: (a) ability to read academic texts; (b) clarity of reasoning and expression; (c) chaining of ideas, power of synthesis and conclusion; (d) mastery of formal written text.

4.3.8. Candidates may use monolingual, bilingual and / or trilingual printed dictionaries during the proficiency exams in English and Portuguese. The shared use of dictionaries between the candidates will not be allowed.

4.3.9. The results of the specific written Portuguese proficiency exams for deaf candidates and for foreign candidates will be announced until 5:00 PM, 10/29/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.3.10. The appeal to the result of the Portuguese proficiency exam for deaf and/or foreign candidates can be made until 5:00 PM, 10/31/2019, through an electronic form available on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica).

4.3.11. The result of the acceptance or refusal of appeals against the Portuguese proficiency exams for deaf candidates and foreign candidates will be announced until 5:00 PM, 11/01/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.3.12. The result of the proficiency exams (English, Spanish, French, and Latin) will be announced until 5:00 PM, 11/01/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.3.13. Appeals against the results of the proficiency exams (English, Spanish, French, and Latin) can be sent until 5:00 PM, 11/05/2019, through a form available on the website of the

Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica).

4.3.14. The results of the acceptance or refusal of appeals against the results of the proficiency exams (English, Spanish, French, and Latin) will be announced until 5:00 PM, 11/06/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.4. The second stage will consist of the analysis of the preliminary research project by the professor board of the requested Research Line and is of eliminatory character, according to the evaluation criteria present in Appendix I of this Public Call. The candidates who present preliminary research projects that are not in conformity with the orientations in Appendix I will be declassified.

4.4.1. The doctoral dissertation preliminary research project must be attached to the electronic form in PDF format without any authorship identification within the application period.

4.4.2. The preliminary research project must verse on a topic that is relevant to the selected research line and of interest to the professor with an open place described in this public call, according to the instructions presented in Appendix I.

4.4.3. On this stage, a board composed by two professors of the Research Line that the selector advisor is linked to will evaluate the preliminary research project following the criteria in Appendix I.

4.4.4. In order to be approved on this stage, the candidate must obtain a grade of 70 (seventy) marks out of a total of 100 (one hundred) marks. The candidates who fail to obtain such grade will be eliminated from the selection process.

4.4.5. The result of the second stage will be announced by 5:00 PM, 11/06/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.4.6. Appeals against the results for the second stage can be sent until 5:00 PM, 11/08/2019, through a form available on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica).

4.4.7. The results of the acceptance or refusal of appeals against results for the second stage will be announced until 5:00 PM, 11/11/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.5. The third stage will consist of the analysis of the preliminary research project by the selected advisor and is of eliminatory character, according to the evaluation criteria present in Appendix I of this Public Call. The candidates who present preliminary research projects that are not in conformity with the orientations in Appendix I will be declassified.

4.5.1. On this stage, the selected advisor will evaluate the preliminary research project following the disposed criteria in Appendix I.

4.5.2. In order to be approved on this stage, the candidate must obtain a grade of 70 (seventy) marks out of a total of 100 (one hundred) marks. The candidates who fail to obtain such grade will be eliminated from the selection process.

4.5.3. The result of the third stage will be announced until 5:00 PM, 11/11/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.5.4. Appeals against the third stage can be sent until 5:00 PM, 11/13/2019, through a form available on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica).

4.5.5. The results of the acceptance or refusal of appeals against the third stage will be announced until 5:00 PM, 11/14/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.6. The fourth stage is composed of an interview of eliminatory and classificatory character, that will consist of an oral exam for theoretical, conceptual, and methodological assessment of the preliminary research project; analysis of the academic profile of the candidate (based

on curriculum appreciation), as well as his/her oral expression skills and resourcefulness facing questions regarding the preliminary research project. The interview will be conducted by a board formed by the selected advisor and two other professors from the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.6.1. In order to be approved on this stage, the candidate must obtain a grade of 70 (seventy) marks out of a total of 100 (one hundred) marks.

4.6.2. The interview will be recorded and will respect the scheduled hours, according to alphabetical order.

4.6.3. Deaf candidates have the right to an interpreter linked to UFJF to mediate the interview with the examiner board.

4.6.4. The interview will take place on 11/18/2019 and 11/19/2019, starting at 9 AM (each candidate must check the scheduled interview hour), on the Multimedia Room of the Graduate Program in Linguistics, located on the second floor of the Graduate Division Building, on the platform of the Faculty of Liberal Arts/UFJF.

4.6.5. The candidates not residing in Juiz de Fora/MG will have the option of holding their interview over web conference. Such option must be solicited through the electronic used for the application process.

4.6.6. The results of the fourth stage will be announced by 5:00 PM, 11/20/2019, on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica) and on the information board of the Graduate Program in Linguistics.

4.6.7. An appeal against the results of the fourth stage can be sent by 5:00 PM, 11/22/2019, via an electronic form available on the website of the Graduate Program in Linguistics (www.ufjf.br/ppglinguistica).

6. FINAL DISPOSITIONS:

6.1. The elaboration, application and correction boards of the Portuguese and Foreign Language exams will be formed exclusively by affiliated professors of the Graduate Program in Linguistics of UFJF.

6.2. The second stage will be conducted by an Examining Board composed of two affiliated professors from each of the Research Lines of the Graduate Program in Linguistics of UFJF.

6.3. The third stage will be conducted by the advisor (s) selected by the candidate at the time of application.

6.4. The fourth stage will be conducted by the selected advisor and other two professor from the Graduate Program in Linguistics of UFJF.

6.5. The candidate that identifies himself/herself on the written exam by means of name, signal, drawing, or any other identification method will be eliminated from the selection process.

6.6. The preliminary research project should not contain identification of the candidate, according to the instructions in Appendix I.

6.7. Persons with Disabilities (PCD) must inform their needs in the application form, so that accessibility and other conditions that enable their isonomic participation in the selection are provided.

6.8. On the day of the exams, each candidate must bring an original identification document containing a picture and a blue or black pen.

6.9. The candidates must arrive at the place of examination 30 minutes before the stipulated starting time.

6.10. The candidates are only allowed to leave the examination room 30 minutes after the beginning of the exam.

6.11. After 30 minutes from the beginning of the exam, the entrance of late candidates in the examination room is not allowed

6.12. The last three (3) candidates present at the examination room must remain there until the three have completed the exam within the established time.

6.13. In each score, as well as in the calculation of the averages, the values will be considered up to the first decimal place, with second decimal places being rounded, as in the examples: 82,46 and 61,42 become officially 82.5 and 61.4.

6.14. In case of a tie between the candidates, the classification will follow the subsequent criteria: higher score on the analyses of the preliminary research project by the selected advisor, higher grade on the interview, and age (with preference to the older candidate).

6.15. The results of each stage of the selection process, as well as the final result, will be published through a nominal list, sorted by classification, with the scores of each candidate, including the disqualified ones.

6.16. No exam results will be provided by phone or e-mail.

6.17. The final classification of the candidates will respect the decreasing order according to the score obtained in the analysis of the preliminary research project, within the limit of places of this Public Call.

6.18. The registration of the selected candidate will be carried out in a period to be announced by the Graduate Program in Linguistics Front Office.

6.19. For the registration of the approved candidates in this Public Call, the following documents will be required, without which the candidate cannot be admitted as a student of the program: undergraduation diploma; undergraduation records; identification document (identity card, passport, driver's license, work permit or professional portfolio); CPF. Additionally to the documents listed, Brazilian candidates are required to provide voter registration card and documents that prove the candidate is up to date with their voting duty, available at <http://www.tse.jus.br/eleitor/servicos/certidoes/certidao-de-quitacao-eleitoral>, as well as a document that proves male candidates are up to date with their military duties. For foreign candidates, in addition to the documents listed, other may be required, as defined by UFJF's International Office by the time of admission.

6.20. In compliance with the terms of art. 14, V, of the General Rules of *stricto sensu* Graduate Diplomas, foreign candidates, in addition to submitting a valid identity document,

must submit, for registration, a temporary or permanent visa that authorizes them to study in Brazil.

6.21. The application of the candidates will imply their knowledge and tacit acceptance of the rules and conditions contained in this Public Call, in relation to which they cannot claim ignorance.

APPENDIX I

DOCTORAL DISSERTATION PRELIMINARY RESEARCH PROJECT

– GUIDELINES –

I –The preliminary research project must be attached to the electronic form in PDF format with no identification on authorship within the application period.

II –The preliminary research project must verse on a theme that is relevant to the interest of the advisor who is opening a place in this public call and must contain the following items:

- a) Cover page with title and indication of the selected advisor and research line;
- b) Text of up to 10 pages (Times New Roman or Arian, size 12, 1.5 spacing between lines), containing the theme, study objectives, justification, theoretical support, methodology, timeline, and references;

III –The preliminary research project will consider:

- a) the pertinence of the theme to the research line and to the interest of the selected advisor;
- b) the compatibility of the proposed theoretical and methodological approaches in the preliminary research project with the selected advisor's ongoing research;
- c) the adequacy of the theme and the theoretical and methodological approaches to a doctoral dissertation;
- d) the originality of the proposal;
- e) the clarity and objectivity in the goal formulation;
- f) the mastery of the concepts that are pertinent to the theoretical framework in which

the preliminary research project in inserted;

g) the pertinence and date of the presented references;

h) the characterization of the methodology that will be used and its adequacy to the theme;

i) the presented research schedule as to assess the feasibility of the proposal within the schedule;

j) the mastery of the academic discourse and formality in writing;

k) the adequate use of references and citations;

IV–The observation of citations or text incorporation without adequate reference to the works from which they were extracted will result in the annulment of the preliminary research project and consequent elimination of the candidate from the selection process.
